CHANGING A DRIVERS LICENCE



What you can change

A number of the agencies will only change your records if you have had gender reassignment surgery. In other cases, however, it may be possible to change your identity documents if you haven't had surgery. This fact sheet applies to adults who want to change their identity documents. This means people aged eighteen years or <u>over</u>. If a child wishes to change their documents it is important that they seek legal advice.

drivers licence name

For a name change to your driver's licence, you need to submit form 1021, <u>here</u> or pick one up from an R.T.A. office. Find your nearest one <u>here</u>.

You will also need to provide one of the following identity documents:

- A Change of Name Certificate issued by the Registry of Births, Deaths and Marriages;
- or A birth certificate showing your name at birth and your new name.

You also need to provide the R.T.A. with other documents to prove your identity. A list of these documents can be found on the R.T.A. website, <u>here</u>. You should be aware that the R.T.A. will keep a record of your old name on their system as an alias.

To change your gender marker you will need to provide your birth certificate.

Updating the name on your driver's licences will cost you \$28.

To change gender on your driver's licence, you need to submit a change of Record <u>form</u>, at an R.T.A. office. Find your nearest one <u>here</u>.

You will need to take along one of the following:

- · your updated birth certificate or
- a proof of identity document (from this <u>list</u>) showing your gender ; or
- a certificate issued by NSW Registry of Births, Deaths and Marriages (or equivalent); or
- a medical certificate confirming your gender from an Australian registered medical practitioner indicating your gender and gender marker, (M, F or X); or
- a medical certificate confirming your gender from your surgeon/clinic stating your gender and gender marker (M, F or X).

You will also need:

- a change of name document if also changing your name.
- your drivers licence.
